On Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> and Thursday 3<sup>rd</sup> April 2025**

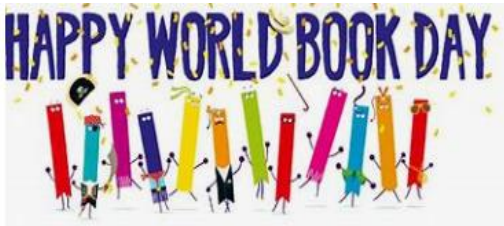
If you require a more in depth conversation with your child's class teacher please arrange this during your scheduled appointment.

Every week one child from each class gets their name in the 'Golden Book' for excellent effort and hard work. This week, the children who received a merit certificate are:

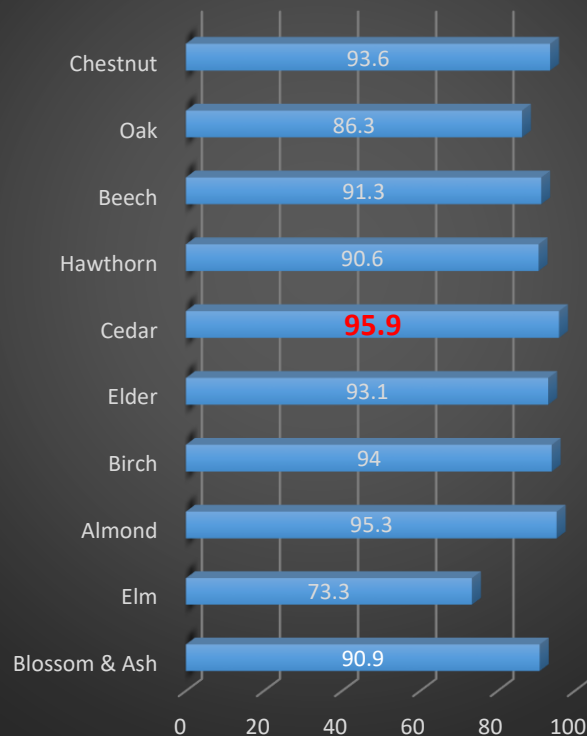
