Faith Award

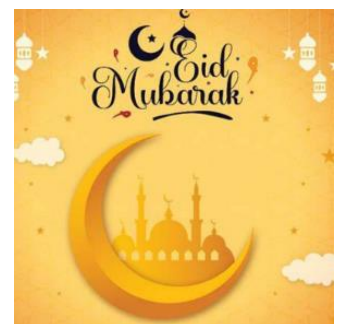

Just a little reminder that the clocks spring forward on Sunday.

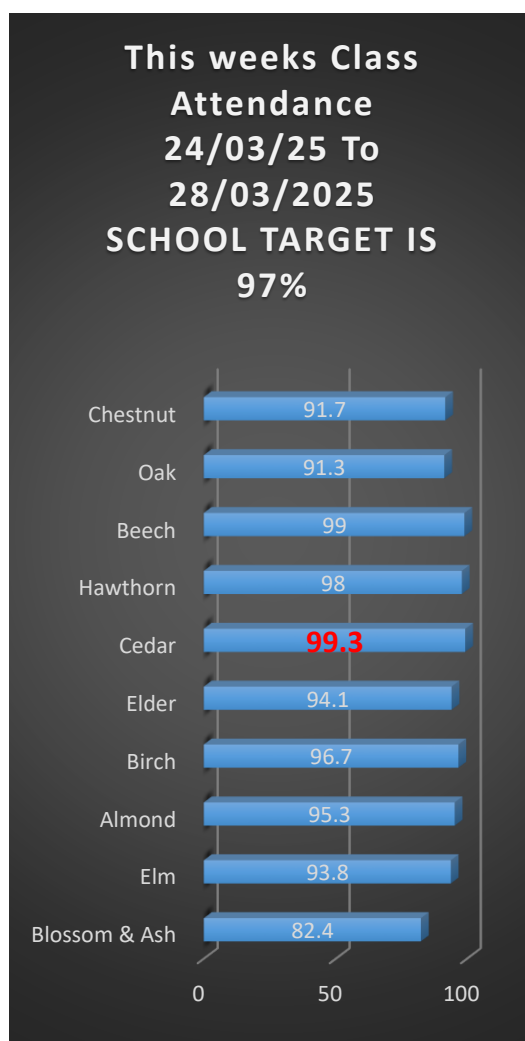
Merit Winners

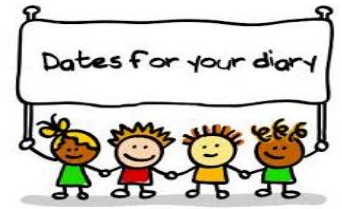
