The Year 3 and 4 children had the pleasure of visiting St Joseph's RC church this week where they met Father Peter, looked round the church and learnt about a faith from another denomination. Father spoke about the crowning of Mary celebration that the Catholic church has just celebrated last weekend and showed the children how beautiful the church was with the Easter garden on the altar and the flowers around to celebrate Mary. Father also spoke about how everyone is included in the parish, even from across the world as he has many people watching from many countries using the camera system which the children were fascinated with. He spoke about how different faiths are united rather than divided and talked about the differences and similarities between the Catholic church and the Church of England. Father went through the 7 sacraments of the Catholic faith, showed the children the host, tabernacle, chalice, the side altars and the children learnt how the stained glass windows go back a long time in history. They were originally put into churches as many people couldn't read or write and so it made the stories from the Bible accessible to all - a value that is still strong today as the church is open to everyone. The windows allowed people to strengthen their connection with Jesus to say their prayers. A wonderful morning spent in church where the children asked so many questions and were so inquisitive. Father has been invited to come to school after half term for the children to ask their questions to him about the Catholic church which they will prepare over the coming weeks. All the children were impeccably behaved and thoroughly enjoyed their visit.



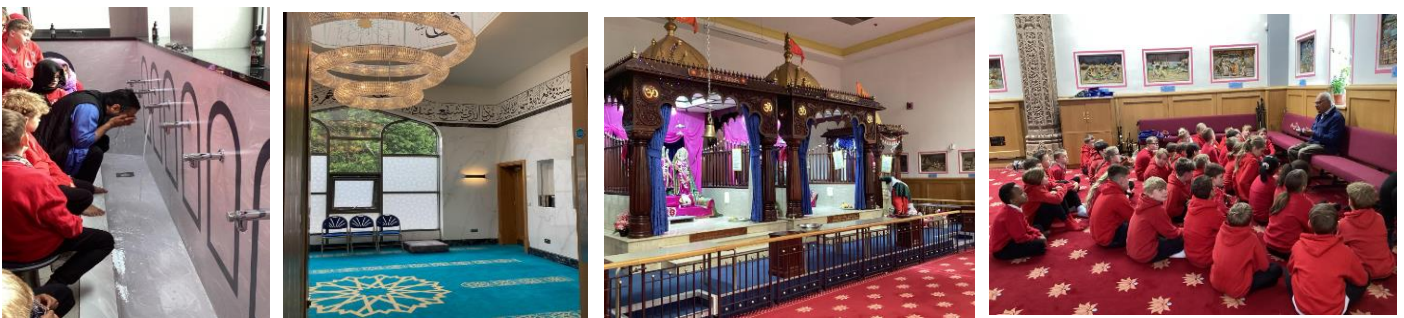
Reception Trip to Imagine That
