Jonathan explained that he works with the migrants who have been forced to leave their homes and are refugees seeking asylum. He was very impressed with the children's knowledge and engagement and they all learnt a lot.

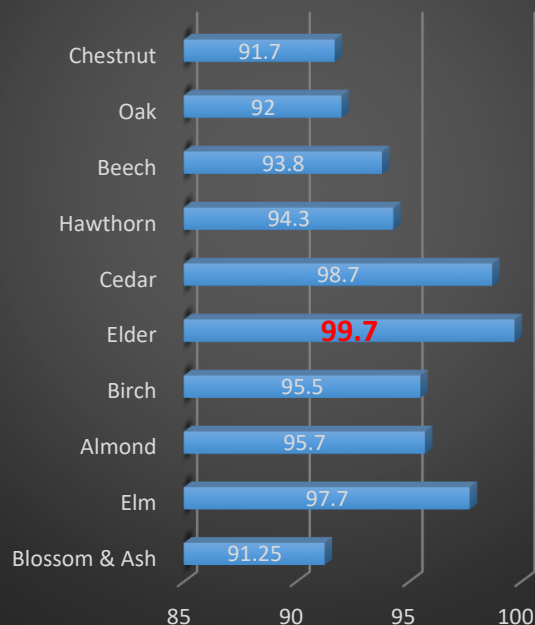

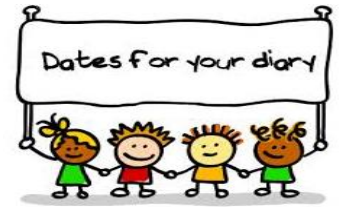
