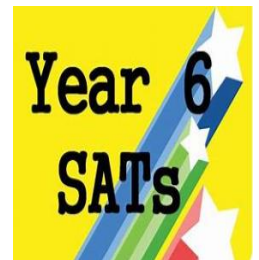

SATs week has meant that the rest of school life has been much quieter this week to allow our Year 6 to have the peace and quiet that they required.

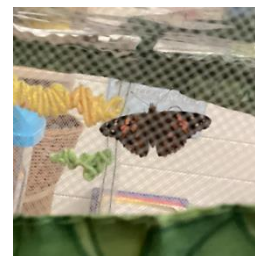
Cook Stars

Butterflies

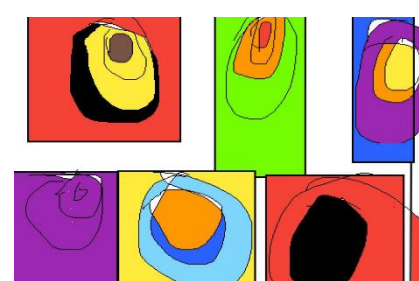
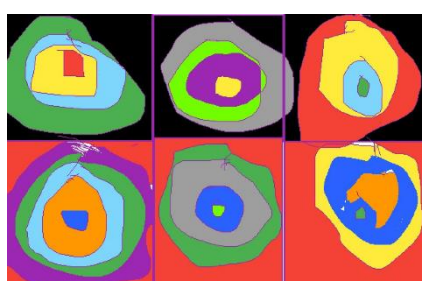
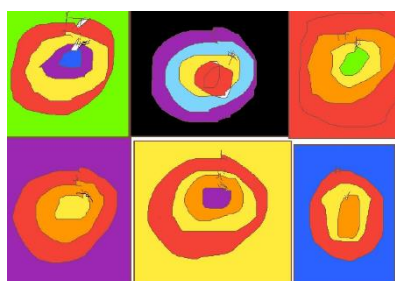
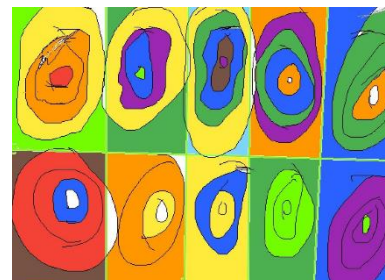

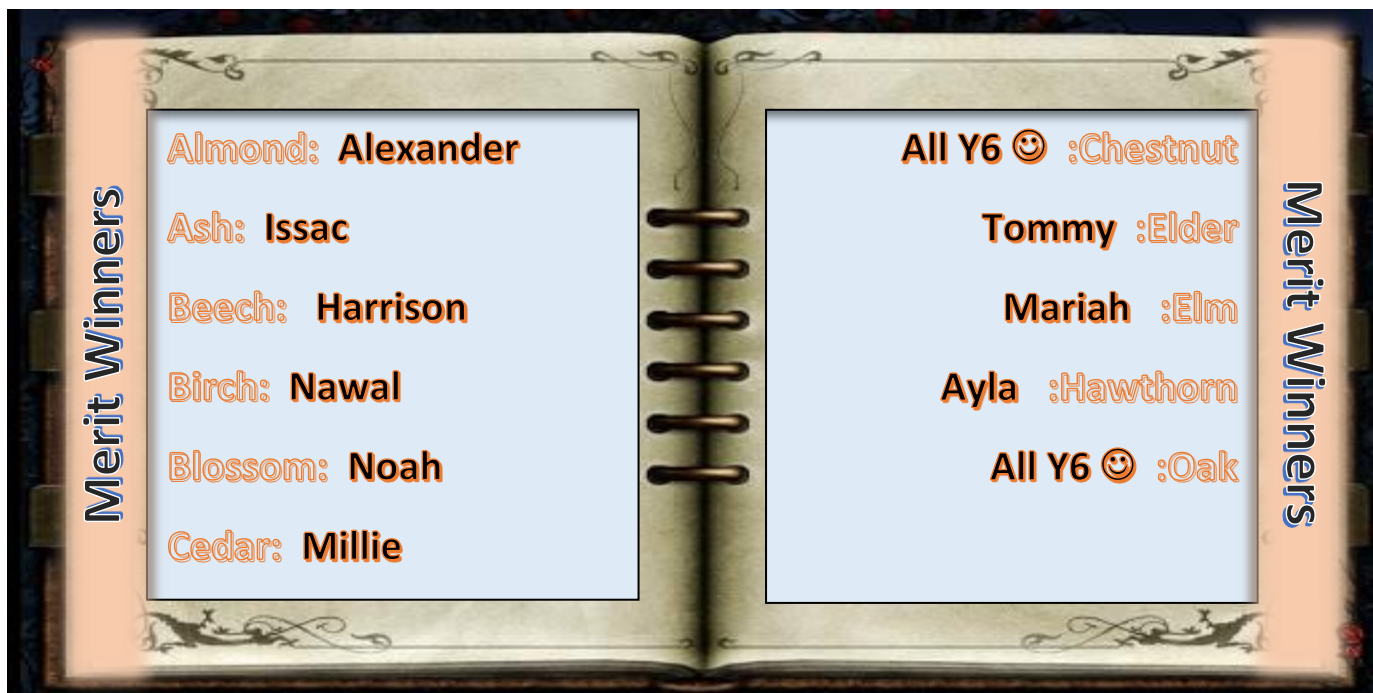
Heart month

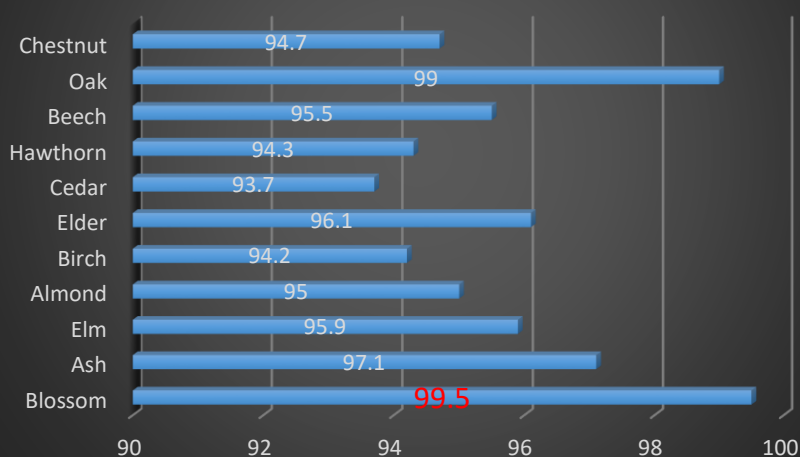

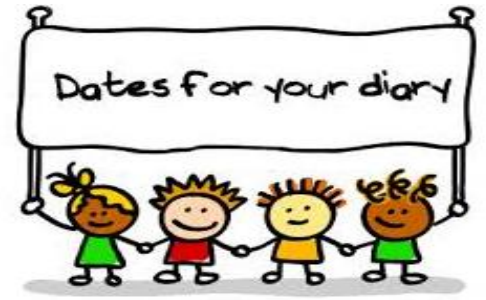
