On Wednesday 26th April, we will be holding our very own 'St Peter's Antiques Roadshow' in school. We are asking every pupil to bring in an interesting artefact/object/photograph from home that is from the past. During the afternoon, the pupils will have the chance to share their historical artefacts with their class and will have the opportunity to develop their questioning and enquiry skills when looking closely at the different objects. The 'antiques' could be from a long time ago, but may also be from the more recent past (children are often very confused by what a floppy disk is and what it was used for or are in awe of the size of an older mobile phone).

We will of course take good care of the artefacts/photographs sent in, but for understandable reasons please do not send in any antiques that are fragile or very precious to your family. If there are any interesting stories behind the objects, it would be lovely to hear about these. It would also be really helpful if you could attach any information about the year/decade, if known, that the artefact is from. We are looking forward to seeing what historical antiques the children bring in. Get rooting through the garage/attic!

The children tied a ribbon on a branch with the other end touching the floor to remind them of the angel sent to strengthen Jesus. The children prayed to God to give them courage.

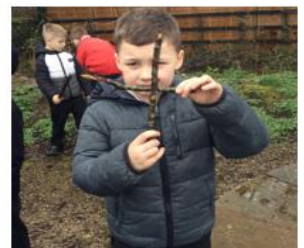


ELDER CLASS:

A parent at Easter Bingo noticed an act of kindness by two of our pupils and asked if both children could be nominated for Faith award this week.

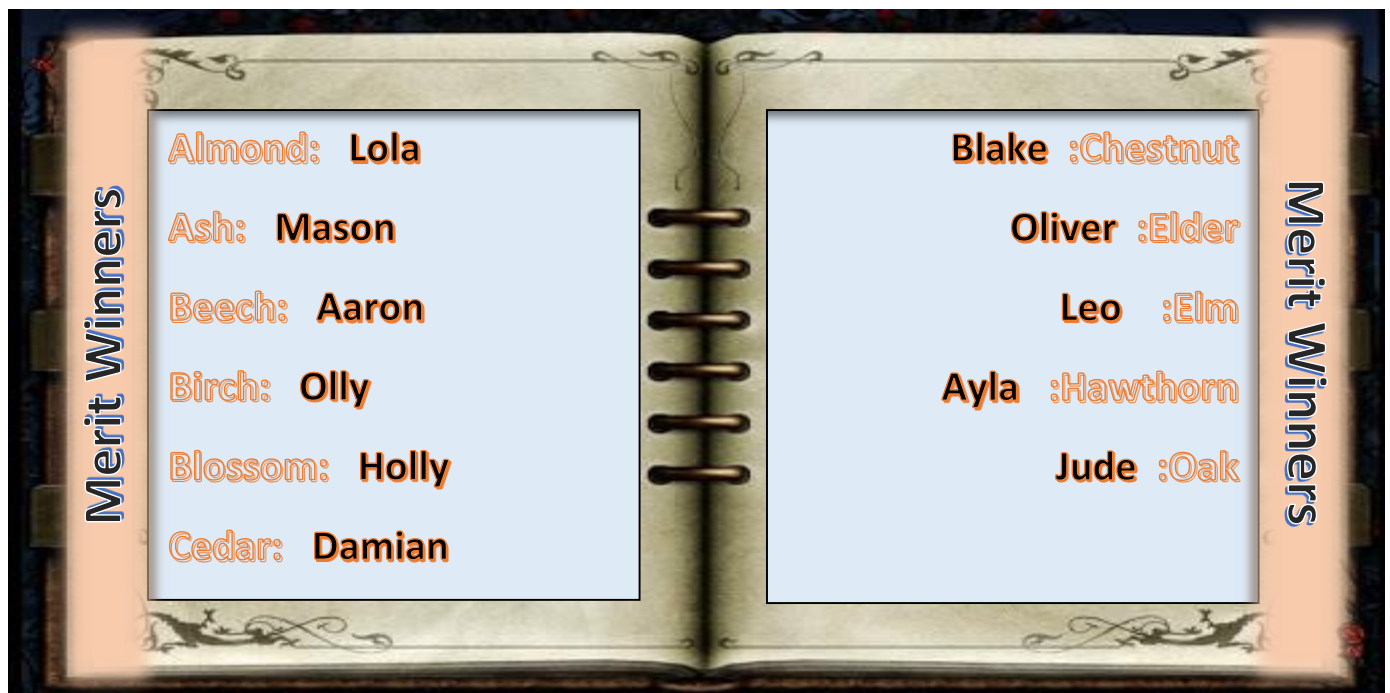
Eliza in Birch class and Laila in Elm class

Both children showed kindness and generosity at our Easter Chocolate Bingo. They noticed other children hadn't won as many Easter Eggs so shared theirs on their table.

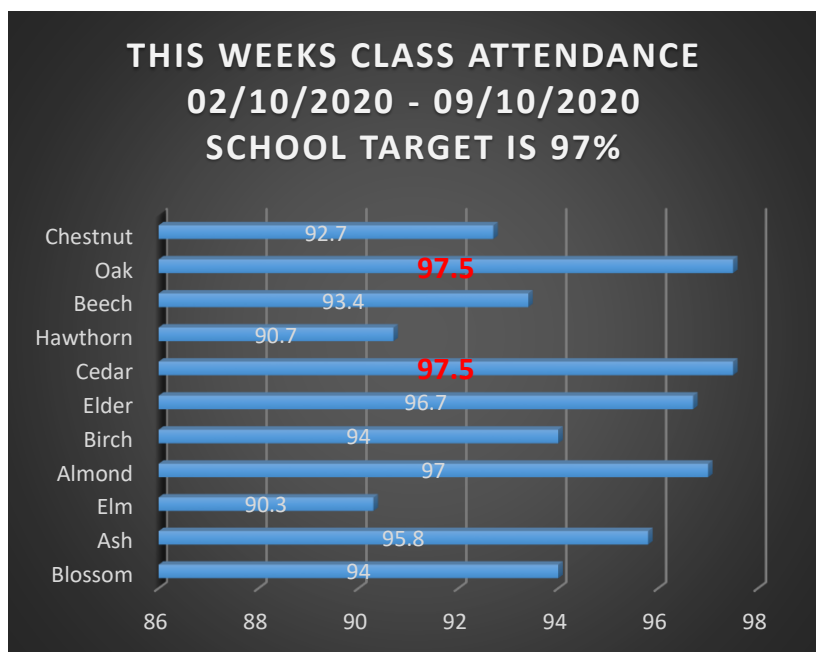
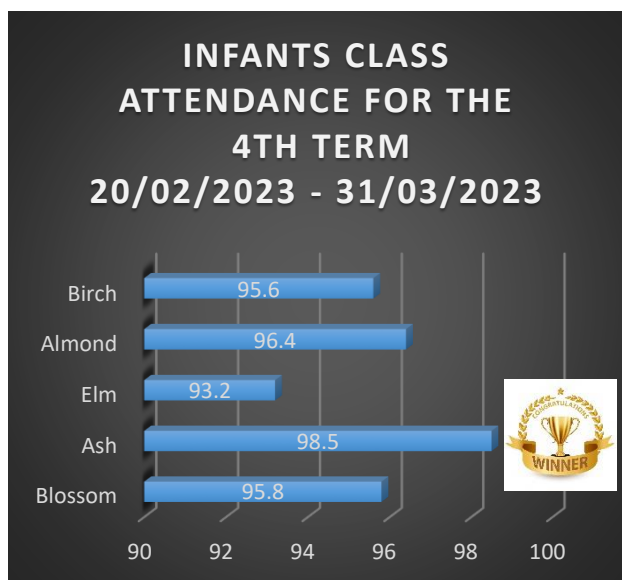


Merit Winners

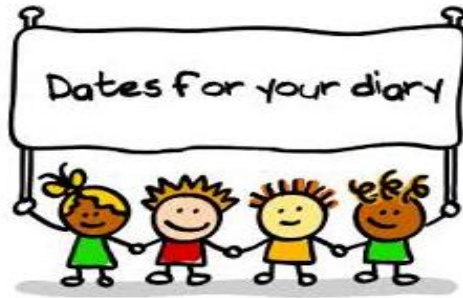
