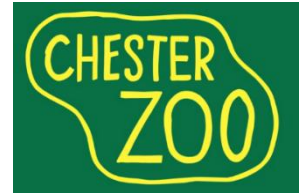


Parents Evening

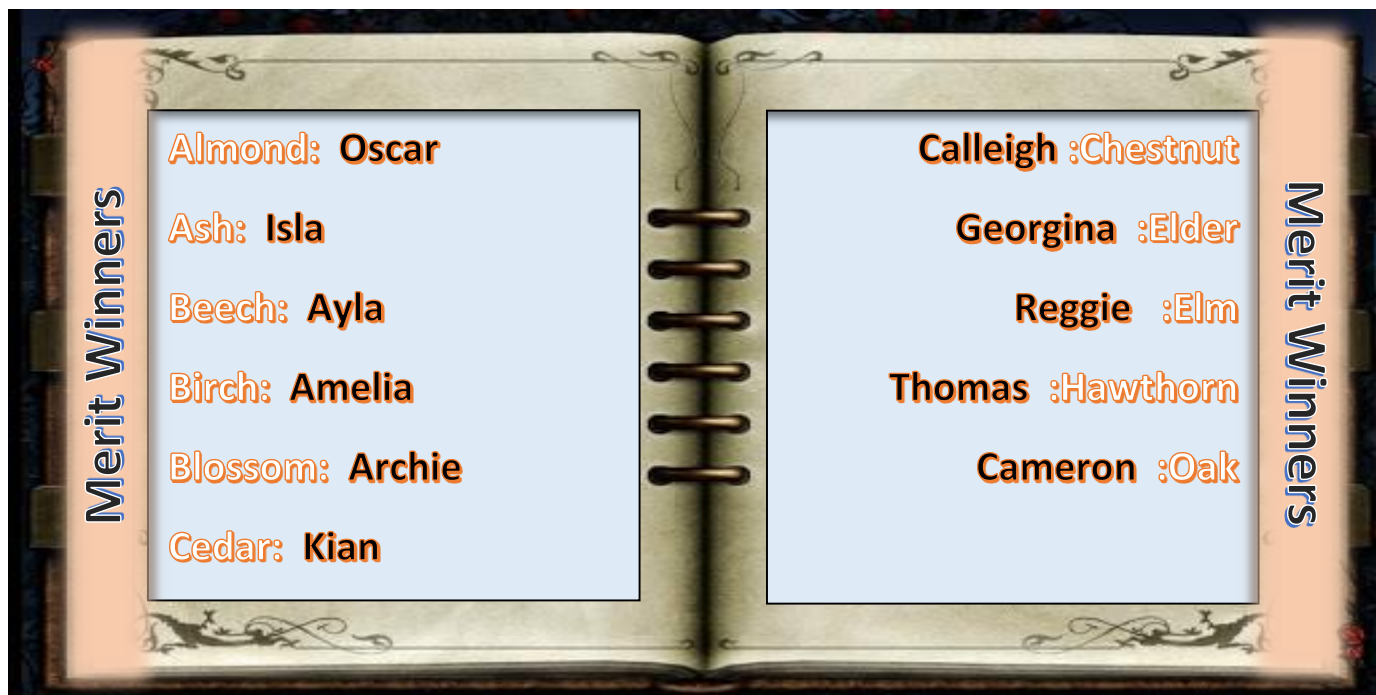

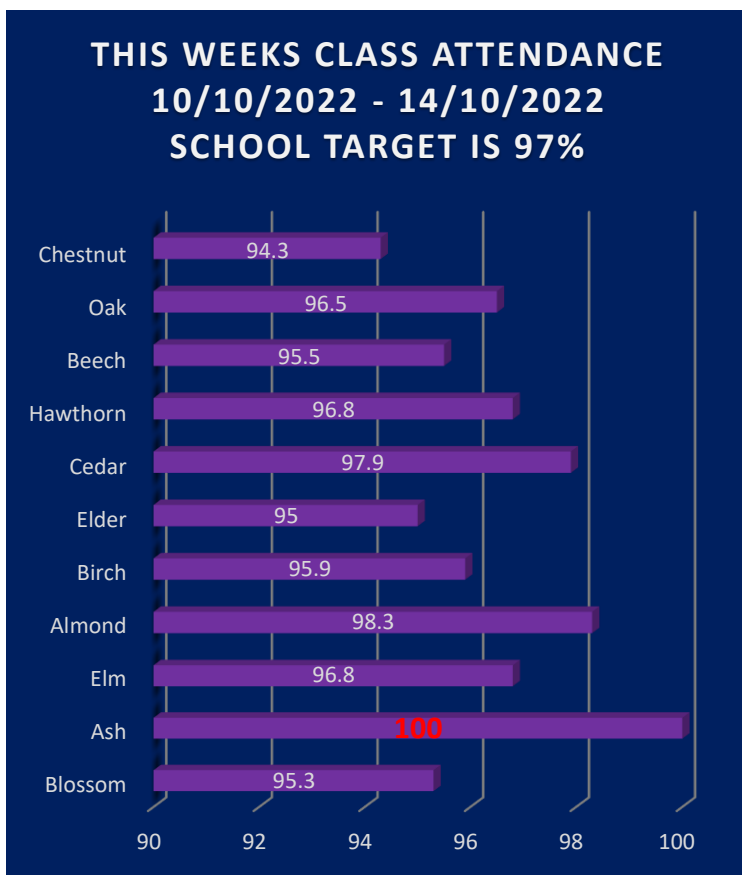
Merit Winners

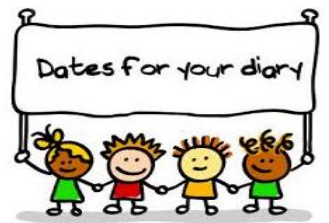
