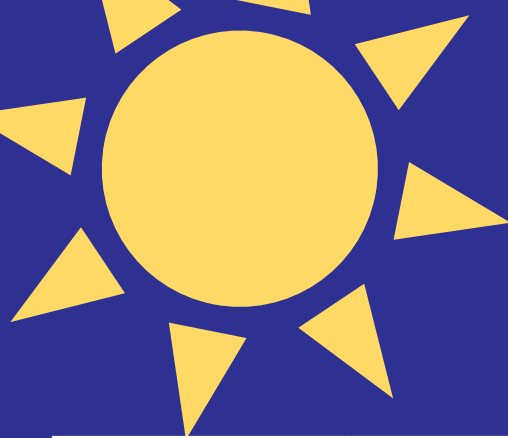

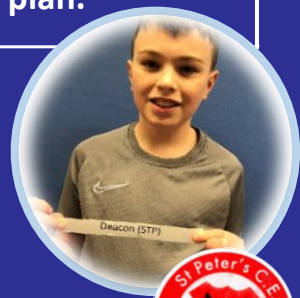

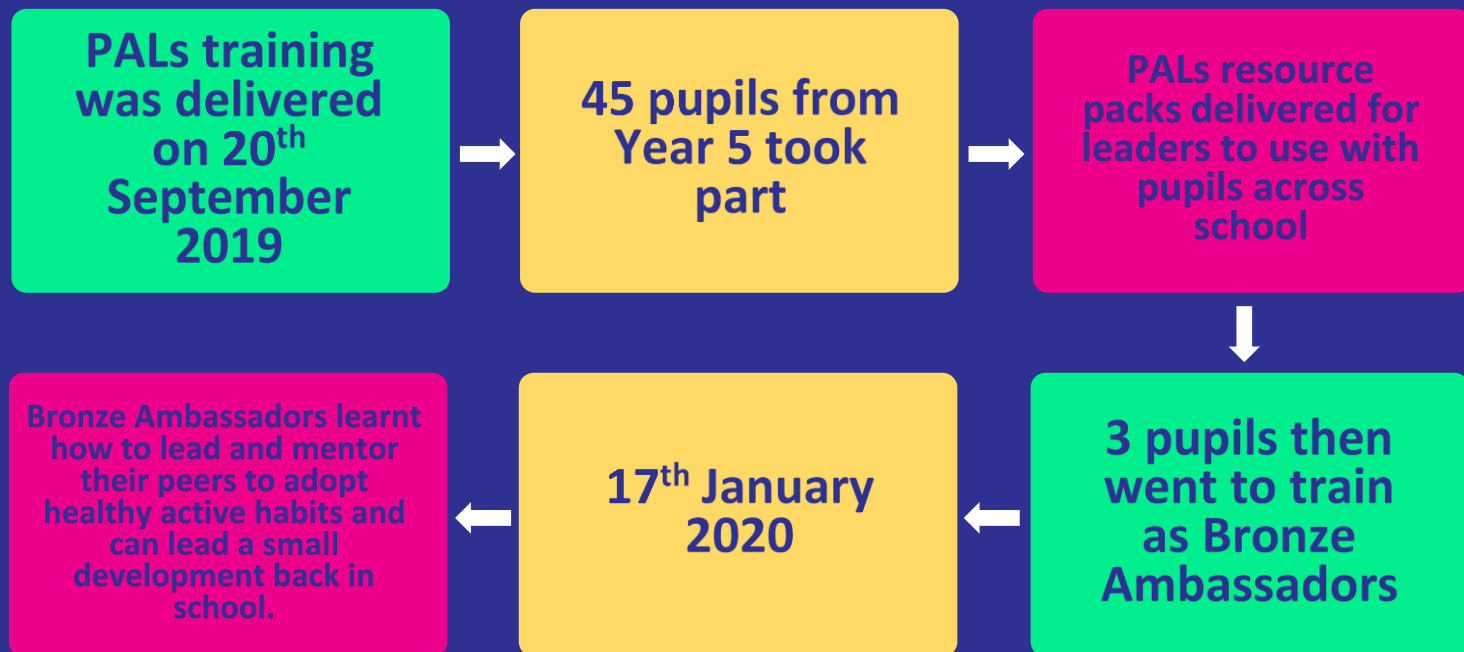


# LEADERSHIP & DEVELOPMENT
