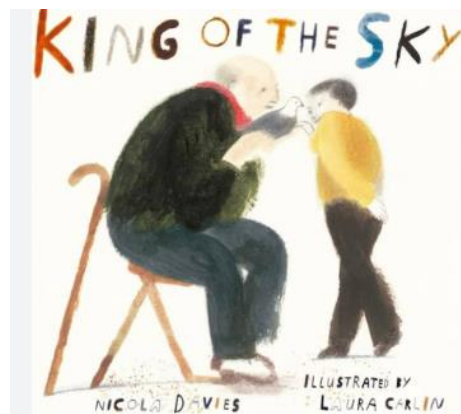
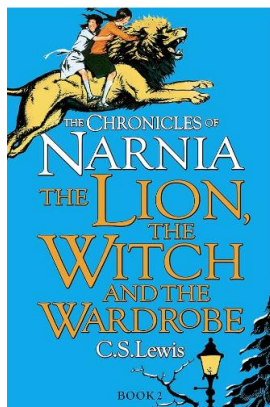
Dear Parents/Carers,

Welcome to Beech class. We have had a busy start to the new term getting to know each other better and settling into our new classroom routines. The children have made a very positive start to the year and are enthusiastic and motivated for the challenges ahead.

In Beech class this year, Mrs Robinson will be teaching every Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon, whilst Mrs Casey will teach every Wednesday morning, Thursday and Friday. Miss Mulvaney will be working along-side us to support the class every day. There is an exciting curriculum planned for this term around the theme of our big questions, which for Autumn term are:



'Where do you belong?'
'Is Legacy important?'

English: Last week we began working on the nonsense poem 'The Jabberwocky'. The children have been learning to perform the poem with actions and have been busy rewriting it into a narrative story. Next week, we will begin reading the classic text 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'. We will develop our own imaginary mythical creatures and write setting descriptions based on our reading. Later on in the term, we will be moving onto work based around a short film called 'The Piano' as well as reading 'King of the Sky' by Nicola Davies. These texts and film have been carefully selected to engage the pupils and inspire some super writing from them.



Maths: We will continue to work on developing our maths skills using the Year 5 Maths No Problem scheme with place value being a big focus and comparing numbers up to one million to start us off. The children will, like last year, complete a two minute times table quiz and this will now take place once a week on a THURSDAY. They will work towards completing their certificates and receiving their special multiplication pencils in our celebration assembly. Please help your child to learn the facts they are currently working on at home, as it really does make such a difference to their mental ability and confidence in lessons in so many different aspects of Maths. We are starting again with 3x table facts to continue to build rapid recall. They will soon receive a new multiplication book to help support them with practice for the quizzes. Doodle times tables is also a great resource and their password for this can be found at the back of their reading record.

Homework:
