ALL ABOUT SERPANS

SHREKOL

Mythological tales tells us that Shrekols are from a mythical race and read after a god called Shrek.

APPEARANCE
Shrekols are half-orc, half-human, which wear leather tunics and have green skin. Traditionally Shrekols are 7ft tall usually, and they have human legs, which are covered in by their pants because maybe so hairy. DIET

CHOUDS

Chouds are a hybrid creature crossed with a man and phoenix. Chouds are mythical creatures which originated from the region of Asia in the 10th century.

Appearance

Chouds possess long wings up to 3m (150 cm) which enable them to fly up to 140 mph and a land speed of 80 mph. Chouds usually have black hair, hazel eyes (human) and stand up to 140 cm. Typically, chouds have gold and red feathers. They have a black beak and sharp claws on their sharp feet. Chouds have no arms but can breath fire. Their feathers are hard so it protects them with natural armor.

Diet

Chouds have a diet of fish, goats, humans, lions, fish, eagles, bears, worms, and camels. All chouds are carnivores but most eat insects, snakes and fish. Chouds catch their prey by either hunting them or stealing up with their claws. The reason that they eat the odd things is they are easy to find in their habitat. DID YOU KNOW?

Personality/Characteristics

Most chouds are very intelligent creatures and fierce. They have special abilities including fire breathing, tail jumping, wing walking and bark chomping. Chouds use their ability to protect their territory, they also use it for entertainment such as fire breathing and sparring. Also, chouds have a talent for understanding every language apart from rat and human. Chouds are well known for hunting and empire conquering of 89 countries. The chouds natural enemy are humans. Chouds weaknesses are the cold, snow, yells and venom.

Habitat

Generally chouds move to hot places including Africa, Dubai, Greece, Spain, China, Italy, Mexico, Cape Town, Egypt, Turkey and India. The reason is even though chouds feathers provide cover to battle they enable them to breathe so breath very quickly so you will never see a choud in the arctic circle. When chouds find a country they find a hill or mound. Then they dig a tunnel which to make a nest in. Chouds usually live in groups of 20-50 but in battle meet up in groups of 5000-10000.

MONARKS

Monarks are mythologic creatures, that possess the bottom half of a phoenix and the top half of a human.

Appearance

Traditionally, Monarks are very moody beasts. They have very unusual body's but amazing!!! wings. Their mighty talons make them ~~fast~~ fiery hunters. Their smallest wings make flying look easy. Did you know? that Monarks stand around about 7-8 feet tall (214 cm - 243 cm) tall.

Habitat

Monarks can be traditionally found in cold mountainous regions in large caves. Their natural camouflage makes it really impossible to find them. Folklore has it that these mythical beast have lived in this habitat for over 2000 years!!!! Although they are very beautiful creatures, there they in habitats.



Diet

Monarks do not have a convenient diet and will eat any thing. They probably like to eat random gods that they hunt for some time. They break their talons with fire and use that their powerful god to fish from the ocean lake that they eat an special occasion.

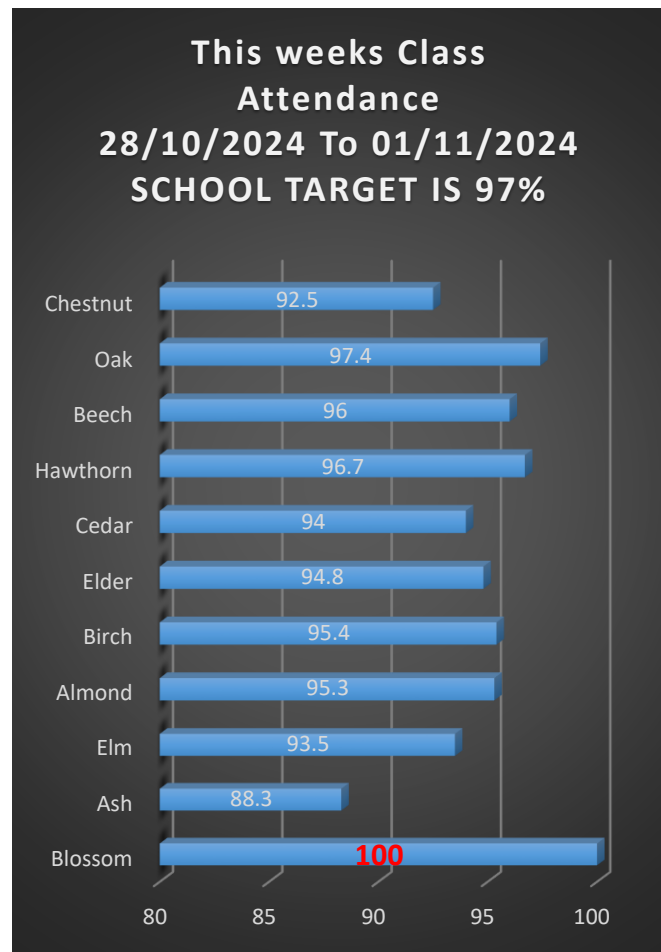

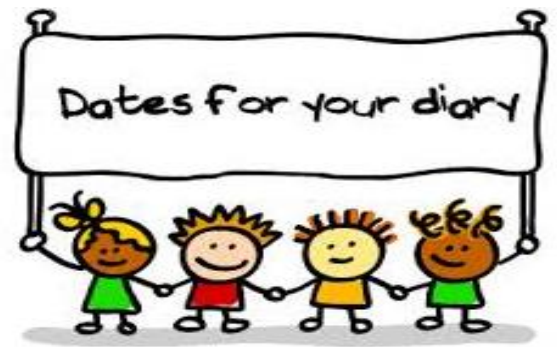
